1. Welcome (Caitlin Bognaski)
 - Welcome feedback on meeting time

2. Park City Education Foundation (Jen Billow)
 - Why don't we have enough funding in Park City
 - 96% of income tax leaves Park City
 - Utah is the lowest funded education system in the country
 - Park City is one of the few schools in the country funded by local property taxes
 - PCEF exists to fill in the gaps
 - PCEF believes all elementary schools should have art - funding was cut, then Elementary Visual Arts came into play (PPES is only Elementary in PC to have full-time art program)
 - PCEF funds preschool programs
 - Bright Futures college mentoring programs
 - All programs are funded through parent donations
 - PPES raises a huge amount of money - important to donate to PCEF because funds at all levels in Park City (where are kids go next)
 - PCEF gives PPES \$141,200 in funding to support EVA, Preschool, Aftercare, Foundations, Makerspace, Coding, Steve Seskin Songwriting, DLI support, PACE
 - PPES gets \$360 back for every \$180 in parent donations
 - Starting in January will have express grants for \$1000 or less that teachers can apply for and have a quick turnaround
 - PCEF / PPES will work together to help get the information out to teachers to ensure they know what grants / funding opportunities are available, PCEF is revising their granting process to hopefully simplify the process. PCEF will host a grant workshop prior to the deadlines in the Spring

3. EVA (Melissa Allen)
 - PPES students get art 2-3 times a month (only get 1x per month in other elem)
 - Doing an enrichment program where pull students from homerooms to do additional projects
 - Very lucky to have the art program that we have!

4. Mastery Connect (Ms. Bott)
 - Program that consolidates information - teacher can make a tracker and make assessments that students can complete (online and offline), can also look at assessments for specific criteria across the country
 - Purchased by PTA

- Provides dashboard of where kids have mastered, near mastered, not mastered the concept; also shows what areas might require more focus
- Gives teacher a way to see how students are performing against the standard and to hold themselves accountable to ensure students are mastering standards
- Gives parents a dashboard of which concepts students have mastered, near mastered, remediation / teacher can include assessments and have examples for parents of why student has the score they have
- Incorporates DIBLES, Foundations

5. My Intent (Ms. Bott)

- Wrote PCEF grant last year, but didn't get grant so brought to PTA
- What's your word - opportunity to collaborate with students/faculty/parents of strength and intent
- Seeing increase in students with anxiety and depression
- Would start with faculty to pick work and make bracelets, create bulletin board, then introduce to 2nd grade and move to other grades
- Desired outcome is to enhance self worth and promote a cultural change
- Considering incorporating into a family maker-space night

6. Safety Committee Update (Mr. Webb)

- Safety audit - created safety committee with main goals to update emergency protocols (complete), update daily safety procedures, educate parents
- Created a safety and health page on website with protocols
- Door will be locked and access based on a code after-hours
- Playground locked and fenced during school day
- Improve safe routes plans
- Need more volunteers - would love to have a crosswalk volunteer in the morning

- Each student has 2-3 pieces of art displayed, performances

8. Aladdin - doing dual language edition for the school play this year

- March performance

9. Principal Update (Mr. Houck)

- Thank you for support and generosity - particularly how parents speak about and to our school

- PBIS/restorative justice program - continuing with our positive reinforcement of student behavior - more information will be forthcoming
- Daren out for training this week - when he is out, acting succession is: Laura Waugaman, Brian Kretschmar, Joe Demers, Shannon Corcoran
- School community council - District-wide goal of ELL support (Park City's ELL students score in the bottom 5% of all ELL students in Utah); will be extending our ELL specialist's role (Holly Ray) from 75% to 100% time, adding in an additional para for ELL groups
- iReady - teachers going through training on our new online math support program, as well as continuation of Ready math curriculum support
- Science/STEM: New science standards come into Utah next year. We have three teachers taking point attending the Nat'l Science Teachers Conference and state-level trainings
- Enedi Hernandez (community outreach specialist) - today was her last day and will be interviewing for a replacement
